NOW IS THE TIME TO BUILD STUDY ABROAD INTO YOUR FOUR-YEAR PLAN.

Did you know that you could complete one-and-a-half or two years at MMC, study abroad for a semester or a year, and return to MMC to complete your degree?

Studying abroad is a rewarding and life-changing experience. Students who incorporate overseas study into their academic careers deepen their knowledge and understanding of international, political, and cultural affairs. You may return from your sojourn abroad with a better perspective on world issues as well as with new friends and a broader understanding of the U.S. and its way of life. Most significantly, when you spend time in another culture, you learn a great deal about yourself. Regardless of what major you are pursuing, from biology to theatre arts, you can benefit from study abroad.

WHAT ARE YOUR OPTIONS?

There are many! You may spend a semester, a full academic year, or a summer or January abroad, and there are various formats for programs as well.

Travel/Study Courses

During January and summer terms and spring break, travel/study courses taught by MMC faculty may be offered. As part of the course, you will spend eight to ten days in a foreign country under the guidance of the MMC faculty.

MMC Affiliations

You may participate in a study abroad program offered by one of the two consortia of which MMC is a member, the Academic Consortium of the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) and the College Consortium for International Studies (CCIS). Between these two consortia, there are programs in over 50 countries.

Independent Study Abroad

In addition, you may participate in a program offered by another college or university or by a third party provider, or you may, in some cases, enroll directly in a foreign university. There are literally thousands of choices.

Bilateral Exchange

MMC has an exchange program with de Theaterschool in Amsterdam, the Netherlands, where Dance majors may take advantage of the option to study abroad without interrupting progress toward their degrees. MMC also has an exchange program with The American College of Thessaloniki in Greece which is open to students of any major.

WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS?

- A 3.0 cumulative grade point average
- Completion of 30 credits at the time of application
- A declared major

The College recommends that students study abroad in their third year; however, some sophomores and seniors go abroad as well.
