- Register for a full-time course load (12 credits or more)
 - All housing students must be registered as a full time student during the academic year.
 - Any questions concerning registration should be addressed to the Office of Academic Advisement at 212-774-0568

· Pay in full for tuition and residence fees by July 20th

 Payment can be made by check or credit card, through financial aid, or by making arrangments for a payment plan. Any questions concerning payment should be addressed to the Center for Student Services at 212-517-0500. Your account must be settled in order for you to move in.

· Submit your immunication records and COVID vaccination form

- For COVID-19 vaccination, you must submit your Vaccination Record Submission or Exemption Request Form prior to receiving your housing assignment. More information can be found at MMC Onward.
- New York State law requires MMC to collect student immunization records for Measles, Mumps and Rubella as well as a Meningitis response. Students can submit their completed Immunization Form or vaccine records for review. Students should upload their records directly to the Admissions Portal. If you have questions, please contact the Counseling and Wellness Center (CWC) at counseling@mmm.edu. More information about vaccine requirements can be found on CWC's website.

THE MOVE-IN PROCESS IN

Coordinating the arrival of so many students in New York City can be quite a challenge, but we have a pretty successful plan in place for the big day!

Our building is located on the corner of East 6th Street (which runs west to east) and Bowery/Third Avenue. On move-in day, cars will begin lining up in front of our building, then on the right side of Bowery, and back on East 5th Street with their hazard lights on and continue back as far as needed. When you arrive for check-in, plan to start on Third Avenue near East 6th Street and loop around the block (east on 6th Street, south on 2nd Avenue, west on 5th Street) until you see the line of cars with their hazard lights flashing. Get in line behind the last car and wait to pull up into an open space. Please do not block entrances or exits or the intersection, and please do not double park in front of the building or the Standard Hotel.

Check-in is in the Lounge Lower Level where you will get your keys and paperwork. Security will direct you upon arrival. When your car has reached the building, please send the student inside alone to pick up their keys, and please have the helper stay with the car. Each student will have access to one bin to help them move in, but we recommend bringing your own handcart or dolly if you have one. Remember, you are allowed to have two helpers inside the building to assist you to move in. Someone needs to stay with the car at all times when it is in the unloading zone.

Once your car is unloaded, it will need to be moved immediately to make space for others moving in at the same time. If your helper(s) are planning on staying, there are a number of parking garages in the area. Please make sure your vehicle is always attended during the moving process.

PARKING INFORMATION

Once your car is unloaded, it will need to be moved immediately to make space for others moving in at the same time. If your helpers are planning on staying, there are a number of parking garages in the area. Please make sure your vehicle is always attended during the moving process.

Depending on your arrival time, this process can take some time. The most important thing you can bring to move-in day is patience! We will work to get students in their room as quickly as possible and your patience and understanding will go a long way in making the day a success!



ABOUT YOUR NEW HOME



Rooms at Cooper Square are double or triple occupancy bedrooms within a suite with a private bathroom and kitchenette.

Room Furnishings

Your assigned space will come with a bed and mattress, two two-drawer dressers, a desk with a carrel, a desk chair, and a closet wardrobe.

<u>Beds are regular twin size</u>, and are arranged in various configurations. Some beds are lofted, bunked, or not lofted.

Bed configurations are permanent and cannot be reconfigured.

 $\underline{\mathsf{Dressers}}$ are placed below the bed or are stacked in your bedroom.

<u>Closet wardrobes</u> are 24 x 24 x 72 with a door and have a clothing rod for hangers, along with one small shelf for items like shoes.

All windows have shades. Student rooms are not carpeted.

Bathroom


Bathrooms have a shower, toilet, sink, and a mirror. Towel hooks are also installed. The shower has a rod, but hooks and a shower curtain are not provided. (Most of our tubs use a regular length shower curtain, but some of our stand up showers use a 78" shower curtain.) Stand up showers are located in suites 2D, 3D, 4D, 5D, and 6D. Our residence halls are BYOTP (bring your own one-ply toilet paper).

Kitchenette

Each suite has a kitchenette which contains a microwave, electric stove top burners, and either one large or two smaller refrigerators. You can bring your own additional kitchen appliances. Dishes, utensils, and cooking supplies are not provided.

Decorating Your Room

We encourage you to decorate your room to reflect your personality and style. We suggest fun-tack or painter's tape instead of nails or tacks for hanging items on the walls—we do charge for holes in the walls and chipped paint.

FURNITURE POLICY

Bringing Furniture

At the time a resident first occupies a room, it will be clean and properly organized with appropriate furnishings. For health and safety reasons, students are prohibited from bringing their own furniture into the residence halls. (See boxes below).

Residence Life reserves the right to modify or add to this list at any time. Additional furniture items found within the residence hall will be removed and discarded. Residents responsible for the items will be charged a \$100 fine per item.

Removing Furniture

The furniture provided in your room needs to stay in your room. You should not remove mattresses, chairs, bed pieces, ladders, or other furniture items provided from your room. These items may not be exchanged, replaced, or brought to other rooms in the building.

Public Furniture

Lounge and public area furniture and equipment are for everyone's use. Residents will be charged a \$25/day fine for furniture removal from the public areas.

Prohibited Furniture Includes:

- Upholstered furniture
- Wood furniture
- Wooden book shelves.
- Headboards
- · Futon couches or chairs
- Bean bags/Pillow chairs
- Any furniture containing cushions or stuffing (including butterfly chairs and papasan chairs)
- Pillows longer than four feet

Rearranging Your Room

All furniture at Cooper Square is metalframed with modern, wooden accessories. Cooper Square was designed with a specific furniture layout, and unfortunately, he furniture cannot rearranged to a different configuration. If you decide to move your furniture, you will be asked to return it to its original configuration and charged a \$150 fee.

Beds are set at a permanent height. Lofted or bunked beds cannot be de-lofted or debunked, and low beds cannot be lofted. Doing so can damage the furniture, and moving it on your own can result in a iudicial meeting and/or fine. Should vou lofted/de-lofted bed require a disability accommodation, please contact the Office of Disability Services to request this accommodation prior to moving in. There may be instances that de-lofting a bed is not an option, and we will offer you an alternative space to move to, if available

Acceptable Furniture Includes:

- Butterfly, papasan, or tailgate chairs with nylon seats (no stuffing) that can be folded up
- Metal or plastic shelves no larger than 48" tall
- Plastic storage bins
- New rugs and carpets
- Office or rolling chairs

Roommate Information

All students have the opportunity to list their roommate requests on their housing applications. We begin the placement process by making sure all matches are mutual. If matches are not mutual between all roommates requested, we will be unable to place students together. While we cannot guarantee roommate matches, we try to grant roommate requests whenever possible. If you have already submitted a housing application but would like to add a roommate, email your request to residencelife@mmm.edu by June 30th.

Remember, your potential new roommate must also request you as well.

While some students will request a roommate, most will be matched by our office. We try to match students on as many of their preferences from their housing application as possible.

Students will receive roommate information during the last week of July. Most students will be tempted to look up their roommates on social media, and while we understand the desire to get to know everything about their new roommates, we suggest students call and talk to their new roommates. Social media can be a poor representation of who a person is; talking is much better. We will not make room changes based on information from online communities, nor for any reasons that are discriminative in nature.

Gender neutral housing is available Cooper Square. Gender neutral housing means anyone may sign up to live with someone of any gender, so long as they mutually request one another. You may also sign up for gender neutral housing without a specific roommate in mind; doing so means you're open to a roommate of any gender identity.

Roommates will not agree on everything, and that is okay. Having a basic understanding of each other's needs helps build a foundation for a good year together. In fact, residents will complete a roommate agreement within the first few days of the semester in an effort to establish a mutual consideration of roommate preferences.

The Resident Advisors (RAs) in your hall may also help you and your roommates with the transition to the East Village. RAs are students who live with you in the residence halls at MMC and are trained to assist roommates with concerns or conflicts.

Despite all this preparation, keep in mind that sometimes room or roommate assignments change from your initial assignment through Move-in Weekend because of cancellations. Up-to-date assignments and roommate information will be communicated to you via email.

While MMC does not require residents to carry renter's insurance, many residents and their families choose to purchase a separate insurance policy, or verify coverage under a current homeowner's policy.

In the unlikely event of a fire, theft, water damage, or natural disaster, Marymount Manhattan College does not accept responsibility for any damage incurred to personal property. This includes rugs, computers, books, and other personal items. For this reason, the Office of Residence Life recommends each resident invest in renter's insurance. This is a way to protect the resident's personal property should unforeseen loss or damage occur while in the residence halls. GradGuard (described above) also offers a renters insurance program.

DIRECTIONS

FROM AIRPORTS

LaGuardia: Take the M60 bus to 125th Street and Second Avenue, transfer to the downtown 6 train. Exit at Astor Place. OR take a NYC taxi or Super Shuttle.

JFK: Take the Air Train to the Jamaica station, then take the E train to 53rd Street. Transfer to a downtown 6 train at the 53rd Street station and exit at Astor Place. OR take a NYC taxi or Super Shuttle.

FROM THE WEST AND SOUTH OF NEW YORK CITY

Take the George Washington Bridge and follow signs for FDR Drive South. From the FDR Drive exit at Houston Street/Holland Tunnel (exit #5). Turn right onto East Houston Street. Turn right onto Bowery. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

OR

Take I-78 Holland Tunnel. Follow Canal Street and turn left on Bowery. Turn right onto East 6th Street. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

FROM CONNECTICUT

Take Route 95 South to Route 278 West to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge. From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at Houston Street/Holland Tunnel (exit #5). Turn right onto East Houston Street. Turn right onto Bowery. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

FROM UPSTATE NEW YORK

Take the New York State Thruway (Rt. 87) South to the Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (Rt. 278). From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at Houston Street/Holland Tunnel (exit #5). Turn right onto East Houston Street. Turn right onto Bowery. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

OR

Rt. 684 South to Hutchinson River Parkway to Rt. 278 West. Follow signs to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge (Rt. 278). From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at Houston Street/Holland Tunnel (exit #5). Turn right onto East Houston Street. Turn right onto Bowery. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

FROM LONG ISLAND

Take the Northern State Parkway (Grand Central Parkway) to Robert F. Kennedy Bridge. From the bridge take the FDR Drive South exit. From the FDR Drive exit at Houston Street/Holland Tunnel (exit #5). Turn right onto East Houston Street. Turn right onto Bowery. The residence hall is located on the right side of the street at the corner of Bowery and East 6th Street.

I can't make my time. Can I come earlier?

Unfortunately, you will be unable to move-in earlier. Resident may move in any time after their assigned time, but not earlier.

How many move in helpers am I allowed?

Each student is allowed to have two move in helpers during their move in time.

What is elevator etiquette during Move-In days?

During Move-In, we ask that if there is a bin in the elevator that there are only two people.

I plan to shop for items when I get to the city. Will I have to wait to get to my room?

There will be limited elevator access during the check-in process. To facilitate our traffic flow, we ask that you wait until after the last move-in window to return to the hall with packages from shopping. If you return earlier with large items, we may ask you to wait on the sidewalk until we can accommodate you in an elevator. This could be an additional wait.

Where can I park to unload my vehicle?

Cooper Square does not have a parking lot or reserved parking area. Vehicles will be unloaded in front of the building, and then must be moved to an alternate location. There are metered parking spots on East 6th Street, as well as East 7th Street (check signage for parking limitations/restrictions). Please be aware that MMC is not responsible for and will not pay for the cost of any parking ticket received during checkin. Several parking garages are also located in the area (see page 12 for a list).
