Summer 2019 Pre-College Program

Residence Hall Information Sheet

Program: United Nations Intensive

All MMC Pre-College Programs will be housed at the College's 55th Street Residence Hall for the duration of the program. Housing is required for all students who are registered for the Musical Theatre Intensive and who will be at least 16 years of age as of 7/1/19.

Curfews will be enforced, and students will be required to check-in with the Resident Advisor. It is strongly recommended that participating students be capable, independent, and ready for this personal responsibility. Academic and cultural programming will be provided on evenings and over the weekend and students will be given flexible time where they will not be supervised, or required to remain in the residence facility. They will be responsible for their own safety and are free to explore New York City.

Resident Advisors will be available to assist students with housing related issues. There will be an on-call Residence Hall Director and there will be 24-hour security located in the lobby of the 55th Street residence hall.

All housing policies are strictly enforced. Students must comply with all MMC academic, student conduct and housing policies, procedures, and regulations. Any violation of policy will result in immediate dismissal from the Pre-College Program and Housing. Refunds for tuition and/or housing will not be granted to students who are dismissed for violating policies and guidelines.

Eligibility

All participants in a Summer Pre-College Program must be 16 by 7/1/19. Students must provide documented proof of age at the time of application.

Program Costs

Meal Plan	\$ 50.00	Note: The meal plan is required for all students participating in a Pre-College Program. The meal plan is a declining balance card that can be used at the MMC cafeteria located at 221 East 71st Street from 9am to 4pm, Monday-Thursday. Evening and weekend meals are not included. Grocery stores and restaurants are located near the 55th Street residence hall. The estimated budget for evening and weekend meals, transportation and other personal costs is approximately \$250.00 This budget will vary depending on student's individual needs.

Room Assignments/Housing Information

- All rooms are double-room occupancy only (2 students per room, 4-6 persons to a suite).
- Suites will be gender specific and each suite has its own private bathroom. Floors will be mixed gender.
- Single rooms are not available.
- MMC will assign rooms and roommates upon arrival.
- Students will be housed on floors dedicated to Pre-College Programs. Other summer programs will be in residence during the duration of the Pre-College Intensive Program
- Room changes are not permitted during the duration of the stay.
- Students must reside in their assigned rooms.
- Room assignments may be changed or cancelled by MMC at its sole discretion in the interest of order, health and safety, discipline and/or maximum utilization of facilities.

Linens

MMC will not provide any linens to participants in the Intensive. Students must provide all their own linens. This should include; sheets (size: regular twin) towels and a pillow.

Mail

There is no mail delivery to the residence hall.

Health/Health Insurance

Prior to arrival, all Summer 2019 Pre-College Musical Theater Intensive participants are required to submit a ***Medical Consent, Insurance and Emergency Contact Form***. All participants in a Summer 2019 Pre-College Program Intensive must be covered by their own health insurance plan and provide documentation of such coverage by submitting a copy of the front and back of the insurance card.

Pre-College Program Housing Policies

Curfew

Curfew is 10pm Sunday through Thursday and 11pm on Friday and Saturday. Students must check-in with the MMC Resident Advisor each evening before curfew. If a student is not present for curfew check-in, they will be dismissed from the program. Students are not permitted to leave the residence between curfew and 7am. Any violation will result in dismissal.

Residence Hall Orientation and Resident Advisor Meetings

All Intensive students will be required to attend a housing orientation on Sunday 7/7/19 at 7pm. The orientation will cover items such as personal safety, housing rules and regulations and specific building information. Students will also meet their Resident Advisors and other program. This meeting is mandatory.

Parental Notification

MMC will contact the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) if the College determines that they have been involved in dangerous and/or inappropriate behaviors that are threatening to themselves or to others. This includes alcohol and drug use and any other violation of MMC rules and regulations.

Behavior and Code of Conduct

MMC reserves the right to take whatever action deemed appropriate to maintain a safe environment to all residents. Examples of behavior are provided below to give students a better understanding of the kind of behavior that could result in immediate dismissal from the Summer 2019 Pre-College Program.

In addition to the policies contained in the Resident's Guide to Community Living, the following policies apply specifically to Pre-College Programs.

1. No guests will be permitted at the residence hall. Parents or guardians may assist in move-in and move-out only. The program participant must be present at the time of check-in to give the parent or guardian access to the room.
2. Disorderly, disruptive, or aggressive behavior that interferes with the general comfort, safety, security, health, or welfare of a member of the MMC community or the operation of the college and or residence hall.
3. Disrespect to any member of the MMC community and/or failure to comply with the directions of College faculty or staff.

4. Physical violence, actual or threatened, against any individual or group of persons. Damage, destruction, or removal of another student.
5. Use of alcohol or illegal substance at any time throughout the duration of the Intensive
6. Violation of the residence hall curfew regulation.
7. Damage, destruction, or removal of another student's work or property.
8. Vandalism or damage to personal property or any MMC property.
9. Smoking is not permitted on any MMC property, residence hall or during any MMC sponsored activities.
10. MMC is not responsible for the loss, theft or damage to any of the student's personal property. Students should protect themselves by safeguarding and insuring their property.
