Pharmaceutical Compounds as Agents of Ecological Change in Aquatic Ecosystems

Pharmaceuticals and personal care products (PPCPs) are ubiquitous in surface waters, and their occurrence will likely continue in the future. Although commonly detected, the role of these compounds as drivers of change in aquatic ecosystems is not currently well studied and represents a scientific opportunity for ecological research. This talk will explore research frontiers in urban ecology and the extent to which contaminants may interact with other urban stressors to drive ecological processes.
