



## *Residence Hall Screening Process*

*Updated: 11.5.2020*

New York State required all institutions of higher education to adopt and implement a COVID-19 health screening process as part of their reopening plans for Fall 2020. There has been no change to the guidance, thus the screening process will remain in place for Spring 2021. In accordance with that requirement, and with the goal of cultivating a healthy and safe MMC community, the following protocols are in place at our residence halls. Please note, these protocols do not waive or negate the mandatory quarantine period, or the test-out option that went into effect on November 4, 2020, associated with NYS's Travel Advisory for designated states, which will be implemented in concert with MMC's other health & safety protocols.

Note: "Move-In day" covers both an initial move-in to the residence hall, a return from a lengthy break such as Winter Break, and/or moving in for the start of the spring semester.

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### **55<sup>th</sup> Street and Cooper Square Residence Hall**

#### **Screening Upon Move-In:**

All students and their helper must complete a screening process on their move-in day.

1. For the **HELPER**: Students will be allowed to have one helper assist them with moving into the residence halls during the student's scheduled time slot.
  - a. Prior to arrival, the helper is required to complete the screening [survey](#) and show the results to Security.
  - b. If the helper passes with a green check mark, they can proceed to help move the student into the residence hall.
  - c. If the helper receives a red X, they will not be permitted to enter the residence hall, and the student will need to immediately quarantine once they are moved in.
2. For the **STUDENT**: Students will be required to complete the screening [survey](#) and show the results to Security.
  - a. If the student passes with a green check mark, they can proceed with moving into the residence hall as planned.
    - i. Students traveling from a state/country with a travel advisory who pass the screening survey must still observe the [Quarantine & Isolation policy](#) upon arrival.

- b. If the student receives a red X, they must quarantine immediately, even if they are arriving from a non-restricted state.
  - c. If student's helper receives a red X after completing the screening survey, the student must complete their move-in without the helper and quarantine immediately for 14 days.
3. Students who do not need to quarantine upon arrival will receive a Tyvek wristband, which they should keep visible- on their keychain or around their wrist until the community move-in quarantine period expires, which is expected to be around September 15, 2020 for Fall term and February 14, 2021 for the Spring term.

### Screening After Move-In:

Per New York State law, all students will be subject to a periodic screening prior to entering the residence halls during the course of the semester.

Starting September 5, 2020, residents are required to complete a *COVID-19 Health Screening* every Saturday, and will need to show their survey results to Security upon entering the residence hall.

- a. If the resident passes their screening survey and receives a green check mark, no further action is required and they will not be required to quarantine.
- b. If the resident does not pass their weekly screening survey and receives a red X, they will be required to quarantine immediately, and must email [safety@mmm.edu](mailto:safety@mmm.edu).
  - i. Upon entering quarantine, their wristband will be revoked and their ID card access will be deactivated until the student receives clearance to resume normal activities/campus engagement and/or the quarantine period expires.

## 1760 Residence Hall

### Screening Upon Move-In:

All students and their helper must complete the screening process on their move-in day.

1. For the **HELPER**: Students will be allowed to have one helper assist them with moving into the residence halls during the student's scheduled time slot.
  - a. Upon arrival, the helper is required to complete an on-site **paper screening survey** and show the results to Security.
  - b. If the helper passes, they can proceed to help move the student into the residence hall.
  - c. If the helper does not pass, they will not be permitted to enter the residence hall, and the student will need to immediately quarantine for 14 days once they are moved in.
  
2. For the **STUDENT**: Students will be required to complete the [screening survey](#) and show the results to Security.
  - a. If the student passes, they can proceed with moving into the residence hall as planned.
    - i. Students traveling from a state/country with a travel advisory who pass the screening survey must still observe the [Quarantine & Isolation policy](#) upon arrival.

- b. If the student does not pass, they must quarantine immediately, even if they are arriving from a non-restricted state.
- c. If the helper does not pass the screening survey, the student must complete their move-in without the helper and quarantine immediately for 14 days.

#### Screening After Move-In:

Per New York State law, all students will be subject to periodic screening prior to entering the residence halls during the course of the semester.

Starting September 5, 2020, residents are required to complete a *COVID-19 Health Screening*, on a notified Saturday.

- a. If the resident passes their screening survey and receives a green check mark, no further action is required and they will not be required to quarantine.
- b. If the resident does not pass their weekly screening survey and receives a red x, they will be required to quarantine immediately, and must email [Safety@mmm.edu](mailto:Safety@mmm.edu).
  - ii. Upon entering quarantine, their ID card access will be deactivated until the student receives clearance to resume normal activities/campus engagement and/or the quarantine period expires.
