He directed numerous dance theatre productions & short films through his own company Singh Productions since 1990 and was Artistic Director of Phoenix Dance Theatre (UK) between 2002-2006. Choreographic works for international companies include CeDeCe and for Companhia de Bailado Contemporaneo, (Portugal). Scottish Dance Theatre, CandoCo Dance Company, Nordic Dance Theatre, Rambert Dance Company, Opening Ceremony for the Millennium Dome and Shaolin Wheel of Life (Shaolin Monks of China), Graeae and La Fura Dels Baus, Gravity & Levity and Graham 2 Dance Company (NYC) He continues to work internationally as freelance choreographer and filmmaker.

The New York Times called Hyphen, "highly kinetic, complex... visually exquisite," and "beautifully performed." Cabeen is currently an Associate Professor of Dance at Marymount Manhattan College (MMC). In her time at MMC, Cabeen has created several new courses for the college; one that looks at gender representation in 20th century dance history, one that celebrates and explores American dance history through the lens of race/ racism/anti-racism, and one that focuses on the somatic experience of participating in Social Justice Movements. In addition to teaching at MMC's main Upper East Side campus, Cabeen teaches at Bedford Hills Correctional Facility, a maximumsecurity prison for women, through MMC's prison education program. Cabeen is also a certified yoga instructor and a teaching artist for the Bill T Jones/Arnie Zane Company. Cabeen has also been a member of the dance faculties at Cornish College, University of Washington, and Middlebury College. catherinecabeen.com.

Alberto Del Saz

Performance Beyond the Camera-Visual Stimuli and Aesthetics



ALBERTO
DEL SAZ
was born in
Bilbao,
Spain. At an
early age he
studied iceskating,
which later
led to his first
performing
career. In
1980 Mr. del

Saz became the Spanish National Champion in figure skating and soon made his debut with Holiday on Ice-International. His early dance training was received at the Nikolais/Louis Dance Lab from the great teachers of the technique: Hanya Holm, Alwin Nikolais, Murray Louis, Claudia Gitelman, Tandy Beal, Beverly Blossom and others. In 1985 Mr. Del Saz made his debut as a lead soloist with the Nikolais

Dance Theater, later renamed the Murray Louis and Nikolais Dance Company. Mr. Del Saz has appeared for President Reagan at the Kennedy Center Honors in a CBS telecast featuring the Nikolais Dance Theater as well as on PBS American Masters series in "Nik and Murray", an award winning documentary film by Christian Blackwood. He has also represented the United States State Department on a tour of India, appeared at the Paris Opera Garnier in a Homage to Alwin Nikolais and at the Next Wave Festival with Bill T. Jones and Arnie Zane Dance Company. Mr. Del Saz is the Reconstruction Director of the Nikolais/Louis repertory and has staged the Nikolais/Louis repertory on university and professional dance companies around the world. Among others: (North Carolina School of the Arts, The Juilliard School, Conservatoire de la Danse de Paris, Ririe-Woodbury Dance Company, The Joffrey Ballet of Chicago, Ballet Met, University of Washington, University of Illinois, Rutgers State University, Brigham Young University, Centre National de Danse Contemporaine in Angers, Southern Utah University, George Mason University, Boston Conservatory, University of Utah, Georgia Tech, Hunter College, Marymount Manhattan College, Barnard College, Montclair State University, Introdans, BallettCompagnie Oldenburg). Mr. Del Saz has been with the Nikolais/ Louis Foundation for 37 years, at the moment his focus is in preserving the Nikolais/Louis technique, repertory and legacy through his teaching and directing.

Jan Dijkwel completed his BFA in Ballet Performance at the Dutch National Ballet Acade

emy, the Netherlands after which Dijkwel performed extensively with

the Dutch National Ballet. Jan received his MA in Dance/Movement Therapy from Drexel University. He has been a regular guest teacher at Ballet West, teaching Company Class, Men's Class and coaching Repertoire. Following an invitation of the Albanian Minister of Culture, he taught, choreographed, and consulted for the Tirana Opera Ballet, Tirana College of Arts, and the Albanian Academy of Arts. Jan has set all major classical full-length ballets and is a sought-after trainer/coach for professional dancers and international ballet competitors. His Students include, among others, American Youth Grand Prix Finals Winner Male, Finals 2nd Place Female, and Prix de Lausanne Professional Level 1st prize. His work has been performed in Europe, Asia, and the United States. Jan teaches and choreographs regularly in Japan and has served as Director of multiple Summer Ballet Workshops over the years.

N a n c y Lushington graduated with departmental honors in dance from A d e l p h i University. She danced as a soloist with

the May O'Donnell Concert Dance Company for over 15 years. She has performed professionally with the Joyce Trisler Danscompany, Theater Dance Collection, The Asolo Opera, and Verlezza Dance, as well as in Leonard Bernstein's "Mass" at the Kennedy Center. She has appeared on television in May O'Donnell's Dance Energies, Mass, and was a featured dancer in a national commercial choreographed by Lynne Taylor Corbett. She is one of the few dancers who set Ms. O'Donnell's works both in the US and abroad. She has choreographed over 30 works for colleges, universities and regional companies. Ms. Lushington has taught internationally in Cyprus, Graz Austria and at Bolzano Danza in Italy. She has also taught Master Classes

in Ferrara, Barcelona, London and throughout the United States. She has served on the faculty at Adelphi University, Montclair State University (1989-2019), Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, The New York School for Film and Television, Stephens College and was the Artistic Director of the Dance In Education Fund, Inc for 19 years. She is currently Associate Professor of Dance at Marymount Manhattan College, and Chair of the Dance Department. She also serves on the Board of Directors of the O'Donnell Green Foundation for Music and Dance.

Sound Designer

Dan Cooper was born and raised in Manhattan, and educated at Horace Mann, Columbia, NEC, Princeton, Conservatoire de Nice, and Fontainebleau. The recipient of an Aaron Copland composition fellowship to Tanglewood, Cooper composed and produced incidental music for several acclaimed Shakespeare & Company productions: 'A Midsummer Night's Dream, 'Coriolanus,' 'King Lear,' and 'The Winter's Tale.' As a multi-instrumentalist specializing in 7-string bass guitar and also flute with electronics, Cooper has performed all over the world, as a mem ber of singer Ute Lemper's trio, as well as the groups Barbaric Yawp, Erbium, Free Radicals, Nine Live, Sound Liberation, Tilted Axes, Vision Into Art, and The Yorkvillians, among others. Venues have included Anadolu Auditorium Istanbul, A ustrian Cultural Forum, Berlin Philharmonic Hall, Bohemian National Hall, Bunkamura Orchard Hall Tokyo, Casino de Paris, CBGB's, Chicago Theater, Davies Hall, Dom Omladine Beograda, Galapagos Art Space, Grande Auditório do Centro Cultural de Belém Lisbon, Hong Kong City Hall, Irving Plaza, Joe's Pub, Jordan Hall, Konserthuset Stockholm, Koseinenkin Hall Osaka, Le Poisson Rouge, Lisner Auditorium, Mäntyniemi Helsinki, Massey Hall, National Opera Center, NYPL for the Performing Arts - Lincoln Center, 92Y, Palau de la Música Catalana, Piccolo Teatro di Milano, Pori Jazz Festival, Rockefeller Center, Rockwood Music Hall, Royal Albert Hall, Staatsoper Berlin, Sydney Opera House, Symphony Space, Teatro Albeniz Madrid, Teatro Cultura Artística São Paulo, Teatro Grand Rex Buenos Aires, Tenri Cultural Center, The American Airlines (Selwyn) Theatre, The American Museum of Natural History, The Blue Note, Town Hall, and Weill Recital Hall / Carnegie Hall, amongothers, plus broadcasts on NBC, BBC, Radio France, Bravo, and RAI. Cooper's music has been recognized with various awards, commissions, premieres, readings, performances, recordings, showcases, and residencies from Absolute Ensemble, Albany Symphony, ASCAP, Artists International, Avaloch Music Institute, Cary Trust, ESYO, Engine 27, Harlem Chamber Players, Imani Winds, June in Buffalo, NARAS, NEA, NEC, NJSO, NYNME, NYYS, Seattle Symphony - Octave 9, American Composers Orchestra - Sonic Festival, Talujon, Tenth Intervention, Walter W. Naumburg Fund, and Zentripetal Duo, among others. Cooper is currently on the faculty of Marymount Manhattan College, as well as SUNY-FIT, where he has created new SUNY General Education Requirement courses in American Music, European-Classical Music, and Latin-American and Caribbean Music. In addition, Cooper teaches composition at 92Y School of Music, and music and Shakespeare classes at Greenwich House Senior Center. Cooper helped create the Community Arts program at Goddard Riverside, and is a co-director of the 501(c)(3) chamber music series and record label Composers Concordance, distributed by Naxos.

Mondo Morales

Costume Designer

Mondo Morales, a graduate of Marymount Manhattan College, has spent his post collegiate years shaping and shifting the costume design field. His background in both dance and styling is apparent in his work; His costumes move effortlessly with their wearer and embody New York City's style, merging urban fashion with contemporary dance-wear. He has costumed for artists such as The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Marymount Manhattan College, The Steps Ensemble, Jennifer Archibald, The Fosse Foundation, Hope Boykin, Earl Mosley, Sonya Tayeh, Pascal Rioult and Jeremy McQueen, among others. Mondo acted as The Alvin Ailey School's Costume Coordinator/Wardrobe Supervisor from 2012-2015 and is currently on staff at Marymount Manhattan College as their Costume Coordinator. In addition, Mondo works as a photo stylist and art director, collaborating with dance artists such as Sidra Bell, Jeremy McQueen, and Christian Von Howard, and photographers such as Jagi Medlock, Jubal Battisti and Matthew Murphy. In 2016, Mondo had a solo exhibit, "Skinetic Moments," presented at G Lounge Chelsea and ALOFT Hotel Harlem, showcasing a series of images exploring color and paint as dancers' apparel. In Feb of 2018, Mondo releasedhis first collection featured in a short film Directed by Angelo Soriano and Choreographer Angelica Stiskin. In

April of 2018 Mondo was selected to show at Fashion Week Brooklyn and was awarded a City Citation by the Brooklyn Borough President. When not behind his sketchpad or sewing machine, Mondo also works as a freelance Make-Up Artist for dancers, performance artists, and bridal parties. Mondo is also currently in collaboration with the legendary photographer, Thomas Evans, on "Femme the Man;" a photo series that challenges gender identity stereotypes.

Philip Treviño

Technical Director

Philip Treviño (Technical Director) is a 2010 recipient of a New York Dance and Performance Award (BESSIE) for his lighting and scenic design for Pam Tanowitz's Be In The Gray With Me. He is also the scenic designer for Camille A. Brown and Company's Mr. Tol E. Rance, which won a 2014 BESSIE for Outstanding Production. Recently, he designed lights for Jenn Freeman/Freemove Dance ...it's time... at 14th Street Y, Catherine Cabeen/Hyphen Give Me More at Theater for the New City, and Pioneers Go East Collective's Gemini Stars/Scorpio Stars at La MaMa and CowboysCowgirls at JACK directed by Gian Marco Lo Forte. Some of his other credits in lighting and scenic design can be seen in works by Brian Brooks Moving Company, Camille A. Brown and Dancers, Henning Rübsam's Sensedance, Kymera Dance, Pam Tanowitz Dance and Chris Tanner/Brandon Olson's Ravaged by Romance at LaMaMa. His work has toured nationally, internationally and at such notable venues as BAM, The Joyce, Joyce Soho, DTW, Lincoln Center Out of Doors, The Kitchen, La MaMa ETC., New York City Center and Jacob's Pillow. He has Stage Managed for Trisha Brown Dance Company and José Limón Dance Company as well as Production Stage Managed for Wally Cardona Quartet's Everywhere and SITE, Kate Weare Company, Christopher Williams' The Golden Legend and many more. He is a proud alumnus of San Francisco State University where he received a BA in Drama and a Minor in Music.
