

ARP (HEERF III) Quarterly Report Monday, October 4, 2021

The CARES Act established the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF). This directed institutions of Higher Education to use the funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. MMC has accepted from the Department the Certification and Supplemental Agreement for the funds under Section 2003 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (HEERF III). The College has used, or intends to use, the applicable amounts of funds designated under ARP to provide Emergency Financial Grants to students.

Marymount Manhattan College OPE ID 002769 is providing this information to the public in accordance with the <u>Electronic Announcement of May 6, 2020</u> by the U.S. Department of Education.

Marymount Manhattan College (MMC) acknowledges the following:

- MMC has received \$2,276,512 from the U.S. Department of Education under Section 2003 of the ARP Act pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
- As of June 30, 2021 \$1,055,418 was distributed to qualified students.
- An estimated total of 1444 students at MMC were awarded an emergency financial aid grant under ARP (HEERF III).
- Funds were awarded to assist with expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the pandemic such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care and child care.
- The method used by MMC to determine which students received emergency grant funds are as follows:
 - ➤ Based on the guidance provided by the US Department of Education (ED), students who attended in the Spring 2021 semester were identified. Students who were pell eligible and students with high need who at census were registered for at least 3 credits were considered for funds. The maximum award was \$1,200.
