THE FULBRIGHT ENGLISH TEACHING ASSISTANTSHIP



Fulbright English Teaching Assistant (ETA) grants support students who love to teach and want to learn a foreign language not ordinarily taught in a U.S. college or university. Students must be U.S. citizens to apply; they should have a GPA of 3.3+.

FULBRIGHT AWARDS – DEFINITIONS

- **The Fulbright ETA (English Teaching Assistant) grant** places Fulbrighters in classrooms abroad. ETAs provide assistance to instructors who teach English to non-native speakers; they often lead group conversations in English. ETAs also serve, more broadly, as cultural ambassadors for the United States. The age and academic level of classroom students varies by country, ranging from kindergarten to university level.

AWARD BENEFITS

- Round-trip transportation to the host country
- Room, board, and incidental costs, based on the cost of living in the host country
- Accident & sickness health benefits

CANDIDATES

- Ideal candidates have had *some* international travel experience, though this is not required; preference is given to students who have not had *extensive* experience living in a foreign country.
- Ideal candidates have had *some* teaching experience, including teaching the arts (dance, theatre, music, etc.). Mentors and camp counselors also make strong applicants.
- Students who have had experience teaching English or who have the TESL (Teaching English as a Second Language), TEFL (Teaching English as a Foreign Language), or CELTA (Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) certificates are strongly encouraged to apply.

DISTINCTION BETWEEN “CAMPUS DEADLINE” AND “NATIONAL DEADLINE”:

- The Campus Deadline: the date by which a student must have completed a polished version of her application and must have selected and gained the approval of her Referees. She may continue to work on her application until shortly before the National Deadline. She conducts an interview with the Campus Evaluation Committee (CEC) between the Campus Deadline and the National Deadline. All students must meet the Campus Deadline to have their applications recommended by the CEC.
- The National Deadline is the date by which all application materials must have been received Fulbright organizations. **This deadline is never extended.**
