- **Group C** – 200 – level: Introduction to Health Psychology, Introduction to Counseling Techniques, Introduction to Forensic Psychology, Introduction to Community Psychology; 300-level: Group Dynamics, Tests and Measurements, Internship
- **Group D** – 200 – level: Developmental Psychology I: Child Psychology (or Lifespan), Developmental Psychology II: Adult Years, Personality Psychology, Social Psychology, 300-level: Abnormal Psychology, Social and Emotional Maladjustment in Children, Attachment across the Lifespan
- **Group E** – History and Systems, Senior Seminar, Senior Honors Thesis, Independent Study (400 level)
